01 Politics

“Influencing And Compromising Politicians”

The CCP has worked for decades to influence and compromise politicians in the West at every level of government—from school boards and city councils to national governments. The CCP also uses so-called "soft power," providing incentives to politicians to do its bidding.

02 Elite Capture

The CCP leverages access to China's markets as a weapon to get financial firms to push for policies that align with its interests. 04 Demoralization

“Demoralizing Through Internal Conflict”

Communist regimes thrive on conflict. Pro-CCP groups in the West, such as certain socialist organizations, were involved in riots and unrest. The CCP also conducts operations on social media to divide the population. During various election periods, the CCP has exerted influence on social media to sow discord.

05 Art

“Controlling And Desecrating Film Studios And Theaters”

Through purchasing or financing film studios, theaters, and cinemas, the CCP has wielded substantial influence over the content produced in these vital artistic mediums. This has led to the erosion of the fundamental right to freedom in art, as creators self-censor to conform to CCP propaganda, steering clear of sensitive topics and promoting a favorable image of China.

06 Humanity

“Undermining Universal Values, Traditions And Beliefs”

By promoting an authoritarian model, suppressing freedoms, controlling cultural narratives, and undermining belief in the divine, the CCP challenges universal values of human rights, democracy, and cultural diversity. The CCP's atheist ideology and policies of religious persecution, including the repression of groups such as Uyghur Muslims, Tibetan Buddhists, and Falun Dafa practitioners, erode the spiritual and religious traditions that are integral to the identity and moral framework of many cultures.

07 Propaganda



“Spreading Propaganda Through State-Owned Media”

The CCP uses Chinese state-owned entities to publish its propaganda in the West. Two main examples are China Daily and state television CCTV. The China Daily newspaper, for example, is delivered daily to the offices of politicians. The CCP also uses Western media outlets such as major newspapers to publish its propaganda as advertising inserts. Additionally, it has used radio stations in neighboring countries to broadcast propaganda into the West.

08 Censorship



“Exporting It’s Censorship Model”

In China, all major tech companies operate under strict censorship rules imposed by the CCP. The regime exports this model of censorship by pressuring international companies to comply with its censorship standards as a condition for market access.

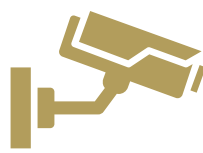
09 Business



“Co-Opting Business Elite”

Western business leaders have become the "principal targets" of Chinese influence operations. By privately pressuring or courting Western business leaders, the CCP promotes policies or politicians favorable to Beijing. Hiding behind Western voices allows the Chinese government to achieve its aims.

10 Surveillance



“Surveilling Through Technology”

Chinese technology, both hardware and software, has been used for surveillance purposes. The CCP has pressured tech companies to provide backdoor access and has used technologies such as drones, surveillance cameras and electric vehicles to monitor Western citizens and critical infrastructure.

11 Opioids



“Fueling Deadly Drug Crisis”

Chinese labs are significant producers of fentanyl, which has contributed to the opioid crisis in the West. The CCP has not taken significant steps to curb the production and export of these dangerous substances.

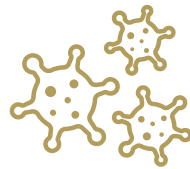
12 Intellectual Property



“Acquiring Technology By Any Means Necessary”

Chinese state-owned enterprises and hackers have been involved in extensive efforts to steal Western intellectual property and technological innovations. This includes hacking into Western corporations, universities, and research institutions for trade secrets and personal information.

13 Pandemic



“Covering Up An Outbreak And Causing A Global Crisis”

For at least three weeks, Beijing knew about the severity of the Wuhan corona virus, but downplayed the crisis and suppressed any information at odds with the official narrative that the virus was containable. The Chinese regime's mishandling of a viral outbreak has caused a global crisis. The CCP's lack of transparency and suppression of information have exacerbated the situation.

14 Education



“Infiltrating Campuses”

The CCP influences academics through various avenues, such as the Confucius Institutes and partnerships with Western academic institutions. These initiatives serve as vehicles for spreading propaganda, recruiting assets, and monitoring Chinese students abroad. They provide the CCP with a platform to shape narratives, exert influence, and advance its agenda within Western academia.

15 International Institutions



“Subverting United Nations And International Bodies”

The CCP has systematically worked to place its officials in key positions within international organizations to subvert these bodies for its agenda. This includes influencing policy decisions and suppressing criticisms of China's human rights abuses.

16 Diplomacy



“Spreading Beijing's Narratives”

The CCP uses its diplomatic missions around the world to spread its narratives and exert pressure on foreign governments to align with Beijing's policies. This includes leveraging trade and economic incentives to coerce compliance.

17 United Front Operations

18 Media



“Influencing Media Outlets”

The CCP exerts influence on Western media through various means such as investment in foreign media companies, censorship of content for access to the Chinese market, and exerting pressure on journalists and academics critical of China.

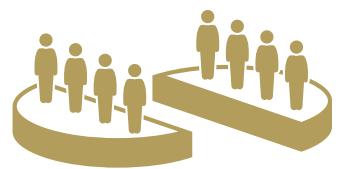
19 Hacking



“Stealing Trade And Government Secrets As Well As Personal Data”

20 Divide And Conquer



“Dividing And Conquering The Free World”

These efforts sow discord, weaken Western unity, and serve to advance the CCP's global influence and geopolitical agenda.

21 Global Influence

Global influence is wielded through various means by the CCP, including economic investments, infrastructure projects, diplomatic initiatives, and cultural exchanges. Additionally, tactics such as undermining alliances and building debt traps are employed to shape international narratives, advance strategic interests, and challenge Western dominance on the world stage.

21 Economy

The CCP influences the economy in Western countries not only through trade agreements, investments, and market manipulation but also by employing tactics like intellectual property theft, technology transfer coercion, and replicating Western innovations to undercut their economic competitiveness. These actions weaken Western economies, diminish innovation, and provide the CCP with strategic advantages in achieving its economic and geopolitical goals.

23 Greenwashing

“Promoting The 'Green' Agenda To Ensure Dependency”

Promoting the "green" agenda serves as a strategic tool for the CCP to ensure dependency in Western countries.
